Discover with our interpretive guides the Canadian Rockies after the glaciers, on Jasper's Whistlers Mountain.

Your begins at the lower station of the Jasper Tramway, Jasper's Peak Attraction. Enjoy VIP line access on this exclusive excursion with the Jasper Adventure Centre. Once on the tram you will ascend nearly 1000 meters (3000 ft) in 7 minutes. At the top, your interpretive hiking guide will escort you on a leisurely hike along the boardwalk and pathways near the Tram's upper terminal. Expect to make many stops for photographs and enlightening commentary about the recently glaciated landscape and alpine environment. The walk involves little elevation gain (less than 30m/100 ft) and distance but boast superb interpretive information and memorable scenery. With our guide, experience a bird's eye view of Jasper town-site, Athabasca River, and the Front and Main Ranges of Jasper National Park. On clear days, you can see Mount Robson, the highest mountain in the Canadian Rockies, 75 km (45 miles) away. This trip offers the maximum amount of scenery for the least amount of effort. Interpretive topics may also include alpine ecology and seasonal alpine wildflowers. After an enjoyable stay you may check out the Jasper's highest gift shop before descending the Tram with your guide. Participants are requested to wear comfortable walking shoes/boots, bring rain/wind proof jacket, and a sweater.

This trip operates from May 1 to September 30. Departures are available upon your request. Please allow 3 hours for this tour.
